- Know Before You Go. Learn about the safest:
 - Routes
 - Vehicles
 - Modes of transportation
 - Child safety provisions.
- Learn about local road customs and laws.

The safest traveler is the well-informed traveler.

- Choose the safest form of transportation for each country
- Avoid night travel in countries with poor safety records
- Be aware of local traffic patterns and road cultures
- When renting a car, insist that the vehicle be equipped with current safety features
- Learn highway-hazard specifics to destination countries
- As a pedestrian and cyclist, wear bright clothing in daylight and reflective clothing at night
- When traveling by bus, avoid overcrowded vehicles
- Use only approved or regulated taxi services
- Wear a regulation helmet when cycling or scootering
- Keep a list of emergency contacts

Road safety is as important as preventative medications and insurance.
